PSC goes abroad in talent search

MELBOURNE: The Public Services Commission (PSC) has gone abroad in search of Malaysians to be recruited in the diplomatic and administrative services.

Its chief assistant secretary, Siti Jalilah Abd Manap, said a selection examination was conducted simultaneously on Saturday in key cities worldwide, involving about 60,000 young Malaysians.

The top 1,000 candidates will be short-listed for about 100 places which will be decided at the Assessment Centre in Kuala Lumpur, Siti Jalilah said, here, at the

Malaysia Hall where the test was conducted.

"We are looking for high-quality candidates to lift the standard of the country's public service. We want the best and the brightest," she said.

Siti Jalilah said there were 14 Malaysian degree holders — eight female and six male with degrees in law, engineering, economic and commerce — who took part in the selection process here.

The successful candidates will be announced by early next year, she added.
